Belvac to begin build-out construction this month

The Bedford County Economic
Development Authority (EDA)

<u>announced in early March</u> that
Belvac is expanding its container

and engineering services with a significant investment in Bedford County. Belvac is building out the 40,000 sq. ft. shell building owned by the EDA in the New London Business & Technology Center park in Forest. The company recently signed a lease with the EDA and build-out is expected to begin this month. "Increased consumer demand for more environmentally friendly aluminum beverage cans and bottles, which better meet environmental standards and regulatory conditions are driving growth throughout the can-making industry. Belvac anticipated this increased demand for our products and services and has been investing to expand our manufacturing capabilities, product offering, and support services. These most recent investments ensure that Belvac now has full-line equipment capabilities to provide full plant integration services, mitigating risk at installation and startup," said David Mammolenti, Executive Vice President, Belvac. Wondering about loans and grants available to businesses this year?

The **SBA offers** several different <u>relief options</u> to help businesses, nonprofits, and faith-based organizations recover from the impacts of COVID-19.

Restaurant Revitalization Grant (RRG): Restaurants impacted by the economic fallout of COVID-19 are eligible for a grant up to \$10 million to cover eligible expenses going back to February 15, 2020. This grant will be available in early April.

Shuttered Venue Operator Grant (SVOG): This grant will be available on April 8, 2021 to eligible entities including live venue operators or promoter, theatrical producers, live performing arts organization operators, museums, zoos, aquariums, talent representative, etc. Must have been in operation as of February 29, 2020. Both of the above programs will require applicants to be registered with SAM.gov and have a DUNS number. You should complete these steps prior to the application process for the grant programs. Learn more at **How to request a DUNS number** and **How to Register in SAM.gov.**

PPP First Draw Loans: If you have not received a PPP loan before, First Draw PPP Loans may be available to you.

PPP Second Draw Loans: If you have previously received PPP loan, certain businesses are eligible for a Second Draw PPP Loan.

<u>COVID-19 Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL):</u> This loan provides economic relief to small businesses and nonprofit organizations that are currently experiencing a temporary loss of revenue.

The Business Development Centre in Lynchburg has loan funds available to help small businesses.

Business Development Centre Loan Fund: Loans range from \$1,000 to \$35,000 for independently owned businesses with 50 or fewer employees.

<u>Venture for Enterprising Women Loan Program:</u> Loans range from \$1,000 to \$35,000 for independently women owned businesses with 51% majority ownership and 50 or fewer employees.

Recently, the Economic Development office went with Tourism to sit down with Waller Perrow from Mariner's Landing and Tiffany Silva from The Landing to help them address hiring, training and expansion plans in the resort community. Since taking over last May, Mariner's Landing Development Company consolidated the golf course and resort amenities, designated the club as all-inclusive for property owners and instituted dozens of cleanup and beautification projects of the facilities and grounds, which include a clubhouse, indoor and outdoor pools, beaches,

fishing piers, hiking and biking trails and tennis/pickleball courts in addition to an 18-hole golf course designed by architect Robert Trent Jones Sr.

Several new restaurants including The Landing, Chubby's, Bottle's and Bites, Bruno's Gastro Truck, The Turn, and a Tiki Bar are all underway and expected to open on May 1.




Minimum Wage Increases on May 1

The minimum wage in Virginia will increase to \$9.50/hour beginning May 1. As of that day, all employees must be paid either the State or Federal Minimum wage – whichever is higher. On January 1, 2022, it will go up to \$11/hour. Then \$12 on Jan. 1, 2023. The increase to \$13.50 on January 1, 2025, and \$15.00 on January 1, 2026, will be contingent on the General Assembly's enactment by July 1, 2024.

Latest employment numbers

As compared to numbers in December 2020, the labor force in Bedford County is down by 166 and the employed number is down by 278. Unemployment increased to 4.2% from 3.8% in December with fewer job openings available.

However, initial unemployment claims are down to 64 from a high of 986 in April of last year. Regionally, continued claims for unemployment, which are filed by those who made an initial claim in a previous week and are now making subsequent claims to receive ongoing benefits, declined to 1,695 during the week of March 20. This was the lowest number of continued claims



recorded in one week across the Central Virginia LWDA since the week of March 28, 2020. <u>Learn more.</u>
