

40,000 sq. ft. Shell Building to be built in New London Business & Technology Center



Due to increasing interest from prospective companies and site selectors, the Bedford County Economic Development Authority (EDA) is moving forward with plans to build and sell a 40,000 square foot shell building on Lot 7, thanks to a \$1.3 million grant from the Tobacco Commission and matching funds from the Bedford County Board of Supervisors, and the Bedford County EDA. Groundbreaking is expected in early 2019 and the building should be completed by the end of the year.
