
Schools await details on Youngkin's plan to boost dual enrollment

From Cardinal news:

Gov. Glenn Youngkin has repeatedly said that he wants all Virginia high school students to graduate with college-level associate degrees that will prepare them for the workforce.

So far, though, he hasn't said how that will be possible or how much it will cost the commonwealth to basically pay for two years' worth of college credits for every student in Virginia. Right now, less than 3% of Virginia's public high school seniors are on track to graduate with a 2-year degree before they leave high school.

The Virginia Individual Development Account (VIDA) program will leverage local resources and expertise to create business training, mentorship and funding to support new and expanding businesses. CDBG funding will be utilized to fund VIDA savers at an 8:1 ratio, providing direct incentives into small business training and development. The project is expected to serve 222 savers, with 125 VIDA savers served in the first 18 months. Read more >>.

Over the past few weeks, we have been able to showcase several Bedford businesses to our guests from state and local economic development offices.



We kicked off our Bedford ONE 2022-23 school year industry tours on September 28th with a visit to **Sam Moore Furniture**. Seventeen students and six adults from Staunton River High School and Jefferson Forest High School got a bird's eye view into one of the largest manufacturing plants in the Town of Bedford.

Participants were able to see, touch, and feel some items still in production and they also got a sneak peek at brand-new items that the company had recently constructed based on a concept picture

provided by a designer. These "sneak peek" items will be showcased at the International Home Furnishings Center in High Point, NC. This is the world's largest home furnishings industry trade show and buyers' market.

In October, we returned to see our friends at **Custom One Source** in Forest, VA. Fun fact: the name of the company actually is a play on words. Custom Truck One Source wants to be the one source that offers one-stop shopping for your heavy equipment needs. Whether you want to purchase a new customized piece of machinery, or need to rent specific equipment, Custom Truck One Source has it all. In fact, they have the largest fleet of rental equipment in the country! The Forest location is their 2nd largest facility nationwide and employs over 180 people.

In November, we held an Automotive Industry Tour. Students from all three area high schools attended a four-hour learning experience that included presentations and demonstrations from the staff at **Wicked Diesel** (Town of Bedford) followed by stops at **Craft Collision**, **Heath's Tire and Lube**, and **Moneta Tractor & Trailer** in Moneta. Thirty-five students and staff were invited to hear and learn about the auto tech and autobody industries. There was even a discussion with Scott Heath about what his experience has been as an entrepreneur. He shared that it takes effort and grit to run a successful business.


### **Virginia Values Veterans V3 Program**

## Is your business taking advantage of the tax benefits allowed in a Foreign Trade Zone?

Foreign trade zones (FTZ) allow businesses to defer paying U.S. Customs duties on imported goods held within the zones until the goods enter the United States for

domestic consumption. No duties are paid if goods are re-exported. Companies also receive the benefit of not having to pay duties on broken or scrapped product. Businesses are allowed to store goods within FTZs for an unlimited period of time. They are also allowed to manufacture products within FTZs and pay duties at the duty rate of either the foreign parts used or on the finished product, whichever is most advantageous to the company.




